PUEBLO COUNTY FAIR HORSE SHOW

Horse Registration: May 1 -- HORSE REGISTRATIONS AND/OR LEASE AGREEMENTS WILL BE

DUE BEFORE 5:00 p.m. May 1. See General Rules for late entries.

County Fair Entry Due: June 1

Final E-Record* Due: September 12, 2022 in CSU Extension Office. Youth must score 70% or better to re-enroll in the horse project in 2023.

Stall Fee: \$5.00 per stall (this applies to full or part time use at show) –

Stalls must be stripped clean of shavings, manure, etc. after youth is done showing and hauled to load out chutes.

Shavings must be purchased with the vendor at the Colorado State Fairgrounds.

SCHEDULE:

WRITTEN TEST: July 11 - 5:30-7:00 PM, then there will be a county fair briefing (will not count as a meeting attended). Those who could not attend the early testing time will be allowed to test until 7:00 p.m. — Colorado State Fairgrounds Colorado Building. Arrangements must be made ahead of time with the CSU Extension Office if you know you will not be there for the July 11 test date. You will have five days prior to July 11 to take your tests, but all tests must be taken by July 12. The test will cover information in the 4-H horse project manual (updated 2019) and the Colorado 4-H Horse Rule Book (updated 2021).

Horse Trailers may be parked off of pavement in horse show area. Please limit parking on streets to loading and loading only. **Thirty minute unloading period will be enforced.**

THIS SHOW WILL BE RUN BY THE RULES OF THE "COLORADO 4-H HORSE RULE BOOK UPDATED 2018

HORSE DEPARTMENT RULES:

- To maintain and encourage a high level of safety for all participants involved, a designated parent, guardian or adult must be present during any County Fair Horse Event to remain responsible for participants and their animals in case of emergency.
- 2. Exhibitors are limited to three horses to be used at the youth's discretion. In addition, exhibitors may carry a separate horse for foal and/or green horse and/or miniature
- Exhibitor's number must always be visible to the judge when in the ring for competition (either on their back or BOTH sides of saddle pad). Exhibitors will be provided 2 copies of their number.
- 4. Green horses can be shown **ONLY** one year as a green horse and if shown in any other class may not return to green horse. You must have attained a Level 2 status to show in green horse.
- 5. Record books will be judged on a round robin type judging in 2022. Records must be kept on all horses used in the shows. Completed horse records will be due in the CSUE Office on

September 12, 2022 by 5:00 p.m.

- All horse records must achieve a score of 70% or more to be eligible to enroll in that project or projects the following year. Youth with e-records not meeting the minimum requirement will be given one week after the grading of books to update/correct the book to meet the standard. Your 2021 e-record score will be used for eligibility to show in the 2022 Pueblo County Fair. If a youth does not drop a project by the project add/drop date of March 1, 2022 the youth is still required to complete a record book to avoid a score of 0% to be eligible to enroll the following year in that project area.
- 7. All horses **MUST** be registered in 4Honline.com by MAY 1, 2022 by 5:00 p.m. of the calendar year in order to compete in any events. If the horse is leased, a lease agreement must be submitted to the CSU Extension office by MAY 1, 2022. Please refer to the Fair Board's Late Policy in the General County Fair Rules. NOTE: State Fair horse registrations are also due on May 1.
- 8. All horse exhibitors **MUST** complete the written test and a showmanship class in order to compete in any other classes at Spring, Summer and County Fair Shows. A completed record book, participation in a 4-H sponsored community service project, and a demonstration must be given to complete your project.
- 9. A random class will be selected and used to break all ties for overall awards.
- 10. **SAFETY TRAINING CLASS** All first year horse members, members who have transferred to Pueblo County for the first year, and any members who have not passed Level 1 (in any division) must have attended a **MANDATORY** Safety Training Class for the 2021/2022 year in order to show at the County Fair. All youth must have their Safety Training Class done by June 1, 2022. If showing at the Spring or Summer Shows, safety training must be taken before entry in either of these shows.
- 11. Any performance RAIL class over 20 horses will be split or divided at the discretion of the judge and/or superintendent.
- 12. There will be no separate classes for ponies. Ponies will compete with large horses in all events. Youth riding small ponies are asked to exercise extreme care when in the show ring.
- 13. Excessive/Correction Coaching could result in the exhibitor's disqualification from the class. This rule may be waived by the superintendents when safety is a concern
- 14. Volunteers are welcome and encouraged to help at the horse show.
- 15. Classes maybe cancelled or delayed due to lack of volunteers.
- County Fair entries are due on June 1, 2022. Members may level up until July 1, 2022.
 Members who level up have until July 6, 2022 to submit new classes in writing to the Extension office.
- 17. **MANDATORY FUNDRAISERS**: To be eligible for County Fair or Year End Awards, members must participate in any Horse Council mandatory fundraisers to be determined by Horse Council.
- 18. IT IS NOT A REQUIREMENT TO SHOW AT SPRING OR SUMMER SHOW IN ORDER TO SHOW AT THE PUEBLO COUNTY FAIR.

SAFETY:

1. Protective Headgear Policy:

Any equine activity can be dangerous! Severe injury is possible. Please think safety at all times. Pueblo County 4-H recommends and supports the use of ASTM certified/SEI approved safety helmets in all equine events. Use of protective headgear is encouraged in all classes and shall not be discriminated against. Helmets are highly recommended for youth in all events while on or off the horse. This decision will be left to the parent/guardian's discretion in classes where helmets are not required.

It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the 4-H member to see that the headgear worn complies with such standards and is in good condition.

A certified equestrian helmet with SAFETY HARNESS SECURELY FASTENED WILL BE REQUIRED FOR:

A. Gymkhana – All mounted riders on the grounds must wear a safety helmet and must be fastened regardless of whether you are entered in gymkhana classes or not.

B. English Over Fence Classes - all riders must wear a safety helmet and it must be fastened

securely.

- C. Non compliance with these rules could result in disqualification from classes.
- 2. While the superintendent will stress caution, the management accepts no responsibility for injury or loss.
- 3. Beginning participants will only be allowed to walk/trot during shows. **ALL** mounted riders should not exceed their levels ability. See Safety rule #4
- 4. Any horse or rider endangering another exhibitor on the show grounds will be excused from the show grounds for the remainder of the show at the superintendent's discretion. Horses having a tendency to kick **MUST** wear a **RED** ribbon on the tail.
- 5. Any member found guilty of breaking any **County Fair rules, MAY** be scratched from all classes, **at the superintendent's discretion,** that he or she has not yet shown in and will be directed to unsaddle and stall his or her horse.
- 6. Horses **MUST** be ridden at a walk on the grounds to and from **ALL ARENAS**. See the Colorado State 4-H Horse Rule Book updated 2021.
- 7. <u>Safety rules prohibit bareback riding, riding without heels on your shoes, riding with just a halter, riding double or allowing any 4-H member not enrolled in the horse project or non 4-H member from riding a member's horse.</u>
- 8. No unsafe practicing will be tolerated in the warm up arena.
- 9. In the event weather becomes a factor during the show, the classes will be stopped until such time a covered arena or other acceptable arena becomes available to continue remaining classes.
- 10. Youth must have attained a Level 1 rating in order to compete in Gymkhana events.
- 11. Beginner Western Classes it will be optional for beginner western riders to use two hands at a walk/trot in all classes. Legal tack for this division should be used -- refer to Colorado 4-H Horse Show Rulebook updated 2021.
- 12. A youth may be asked to drop classes if show management makes the determination that the horse or the participant are deemed to be unsafe.

It is the expectation of the Superintendent and CSU Extension management that ALL horses and riders, regardless of age or level will maintain control at all times. Any special accommodations necessary for the safety of the 4-H member should be brought to the Superintendent's attention before classes begin if possible.

CHAMPIONSHIP SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

The Pueblo County Fair recognizes the top showmanship exhibitors in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior age groups. Therefore, at County fair we offer special "Champion Showmanship Classes" for each of these age groups. (classes 407. 408, 409). The Champion and Reserve Champion in these classes will receive awards. BOTH ENGLISH AND WESTERN ATTIRE IS ACCEPTABLE. No points towards overall awarded in these classes. The Championship Showmanship Class will take place Saturday, following Western Showmanship classes.

ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST ELIGIBILITY:

The top two exhibitors in each of our CHAMPIONSHIP SHOWMANSHIP classes earn the right to participate in the ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST on Saturday, July 30, 2022. If the First or Second place exhibitor is unable or unwilling to participate then the 3rd place exhibitor will be eligible and down the placings. (See page 24 of General Livestock Rules for more information on the Round Robin Contest)

GREEN HORSE SHOW

These classes are to help youth starting to train a new horse and give them valuable arena experience. No points WILL BE AWARDED FOR THESE CLASSES. See Rule #1—Horse Rules. The horse may only be shown in Green Horse classes for one year. A green horse **may not** return to any Green Horse class once they have competed in any other classes. You must have attained a Level 2 status to show in green horse.

AWARDS:

The Champion and Reserve Champion in each class will receive one streamer rosettes if merited.

Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Overall will be selected on total points earned using the system listed in the American System Rules. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion special awards will be awarded for each level or age division in English, Western, Working Ranch Horse, Gymkhana, Miniature and Foal. At the Horse Awards Banquet, overall placings from 3rd to 5th will receive a smaller one streamer rosette in all divisions. A random class will be drawn to break ties for Overall.

NOTE: Show management reserves the right to adjust the schedule. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to notify show management of any arena conflicts.

- Trimming inside ears is discouraged.
- Trimming bridle path is allowed, also trimming of fetlocks or excessive (long) facial hair.
- Equipment with silver should not count over a good working outfit. Silver on bridles and saddles is discouraged.
- Youth must use the same horse in all Working Ranch Horse Classes.
