2020 VIRTUAL PUEBLO COUNTY FAIR HORSE SHOW

Horse Registration: May 1 -- HORSE REGISTRATIONS AND/OR LEASE AGREEMENTS WILL BE DUE BEFORE 5:00 p.m. May 1. See General Rules for late entries.

2020 Virtual County Fair Entry Due: June 1

Final E-Record* Due: September 14, 2020 in CSU Extension Office. Youth must score 70% or better to re-enroll in the horse project in 2021.

SPECIAL VIRTUAL SHOW RULES AND INSTRUCTIONS:

- For the 2020 Virtual Pueblo County Fair Horse show the in-person County written tests have been cancelled.
- Show is for youth enrolled in the Pueblo County 4-H Horse project or FFA.
- Sunday, July 5th 2020- Patterns for each class will be posted as a discussion on the Pueblo County Fair Virtual Horse Show Facebook Group Facebook page. You will need to be a member of this group to post. (Patterns can also be emailed to riders) Patterns will include measurements between cones and where to video from
- Beginning July 12th until 11:59 p.m. July 18th, riders will upload one video per class under the posted pattern. You can video your pattern at home (a flat riding surface will do; an arena is not necessary)
- At the beginning of video, exhibitor or person videoing will say the rider's number as well as class name, age group and level, and assigned rider number.
- **Fancy show clothes not required.**
Miniature, Western and Ranch Exhibitors will need to wear Western Hat or Helmet, Long Sleeve Shirt, Long Pants/Jeans and Boots.
English Exhibitors will need to wear Helmet, Long Sleeve Shirt, Long Pants/Jeans/Breeches and Boots
- Classes will be judged between Sunday, July 19th and Saturday, July 25th and placed 1st through 10th. Each class score sheet will be posted after class is placed. Judge: Taylor Hadden
- **Have Fun and be Kind!**
- This is a chance to connect with your friends and have some fun with your horses. Keep comments positive. There will be zero tolerance for mean talk. 4-H members, leaders, and parents are expected to follow the 4-H code of conduct

Failure to do so will result in being removed from the group and may be reported to your extension agent.

THIS SHOW WILL BE RUN BY THE RULES OF THE "COLORADO 4-H HORSE RULE BOOK UPDATED 2018"

HORSE DEPARTMENT RULES:

1. Exhibitors are limited to three horses to be used at the youth's discretion. In addition, exhibitors may carry a separate horse for foal and/or green horse and/or a miniature.
2. Record books will be judged on a round robin type judging in 2020. Records must be kept on all horses used in the shows. Completed horse records will be due in the CSUE Office on September 14, 2020 by 5:00 p.m.
3. A completed record book, participation in a 4-H sponsored community service project, and a demonstration must be given to complete your project. All horse records must achieve a score of 70% or more to be eligible to enroll in that project or projects the following year. Youth with e-records not meeting the minimum requirement will be given one week after the grading of books to update/correct the book to meet the standard. Your 2020 e-record score will be used for eligibility to show in the 2021 Pueblo County Fair. If a youth does not drop a project by the project add/drop date of March 1, the youth is still required to complete a record book to avoid a score of 0% to be eligible to enroll the following year in that project area. For the 2020 4-H year, if you are unable to complete based on circumstances surrounding the COVID-19 virus penalties

regarding project eligibility may be waived. For additional information regarding this please reach out to Jennifer Johnston the 4-H agent.

6. All horses **MUST** be registered in 4Honline.com by **MAY 1 by 5:00 p.m.** of the calendar year in order to compete in any events. If the horse is leased, a lease agreement must be submitted to the CSU Extension office by MAY 1. **Please refer to the Fair Board's Late Policy in the General 2020 Virtual County Fair Rules.**
NOTE: State Fair horse registrations are also due on May 1.
7. A random class will be selected and used to break all ties for overall awards.
8. For the 2020 Virtual Pueblo County Fair Horse Show, the Pueblo County safety check-off requirement is being waived due to the COVID-19 virus. Parents are welcome to approach leaders for help with safety issues.
12. Excessive/Correction Coaching could result in the exhibitor's disqualification from the class. This rule may be waived by the superintendents when safety is a concern
13. 2020 Virtual County Fair entries are due on June1, 2020. Members may level up until July 1, 2020. Members who level up have until July 6, 2020 to submit new classes in writing to the Extension office. Due to virtual classes, exhibitors can submit class additions until July 1st through email to Marnie (leinberger@pueblounty.us) which contains the exhibitor's name, the class number they are wanting to add and the horse's name that will be entered into that new class.
14. **IT IS NOT A REQUIREMENT TO SHOW AT SPRING OR SUMMER SHOW IN ORDER TO SHOW AT THE 2020 VIRTUAL COUNTY FAIR.**

SAFETY:

1. Protective Headgear Policy:

Any equine activity can be dangerous! Severe injury is possible. Please think safety at all times. Pueblo County 4-H recommends and supports the use of ASTM certified/SEI approved safety helmets in all equine events. Use of protective headgear is encouraged in all classes and shall not be discriminated against. Helmets are highly recommended for youth in all events while on or off the horse. This decision will be left to the parent/guardian's discretion in classes where helmets are not required.

It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the 4-H member to see that the headgear worn complies with such standards and is in good condition.

C. Non-compliance with these rules could result in disqualification from classes.
2. While the superintendent will stress caution, the management accepts no responsibility for injury or loss.
3. Beginning participants will only be allowed to walk/trot during shows. **ALL** mounted riders should not exceed their levels ability.
4. Any member found guilty of breaking any 2020 Virtual **County Fair rules, MAY** be scratched from all classes, **at the superintendent's discretion**
5. **Safety rules prohibit bareback riding, riding without heels on your shoes, riding with just a halter, riding double or allowing any 4-H member not enrolled in the horse project or non 4-H member from riding a member's horse.**
6. Beginner Western Classes - it will be optional for beginner western riders to use two hands at a walk/trot in all classes. Legal tack for this division should be used -- refer to Colorado 4-H Horse Show Rulebook updated 2019.

CHAMPIONSHIP SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

The Pueblo County Fair recognizes the top showmanship exhibitors in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior age groups. Therefore, the 2020 Virtual County fair will offer special "Champion Showmanship Classes" for each of these age groups. (classes 407, 408, 409). The Champion and Reserve Champion in these classes will receive awards. BOTH ENGLISH AND WESTERN ATTIRE IS ACCEPTABLE. No points towards overall awarded in these classes.

GREEN HORSE SHOW

These classes are to help youth starting to train a new horse and give them valuable arena experience. No points WILL BE AWARDED FOR THESE CLASSES. See Rule #1—Horse Rules. The horse may only be shown in Green Horse classes for one year. A green horse **may not** return to any Green Horse class once they have competed in any other classes. You must have attained a Level 2 status to show in green horse.

General Working Ranch Horse Rules:

- Ranch Showmanship -- Horses are to be shown in a good working halter: braided, nylon or plain leather.
- Hoof polish is not required or recommended.
- No braided or banded manes or tail extensions.
- Trimming inside ears is discouraged.
- Trimming bridle path is allowed, also trimming of fetlocks or excessive (long) facial hair.
- Equipment with silver should not count over a good working outfit. Silver on bridles and saddles is discouraged.

Youth must use the same horse in all Working Ranch Horse Classes.

AWARDS:

Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Overall will be selected on total points earned using the system listed in the American System Rules.

For the 2020 Virtual Pueblo County Fair Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Gift Certificates will be awarded for each level or age division in English, Western, Working Ranch Horse, Miniature and Foal

It is the expectation of the Superintendent and CSU Extension management that ALL horses and riders, regardless of age or level will maintain control at all times. Any special accommodations necessary for the safety of the 4-H member should be brought to the Superintendent's attention before classes begin if possible.
